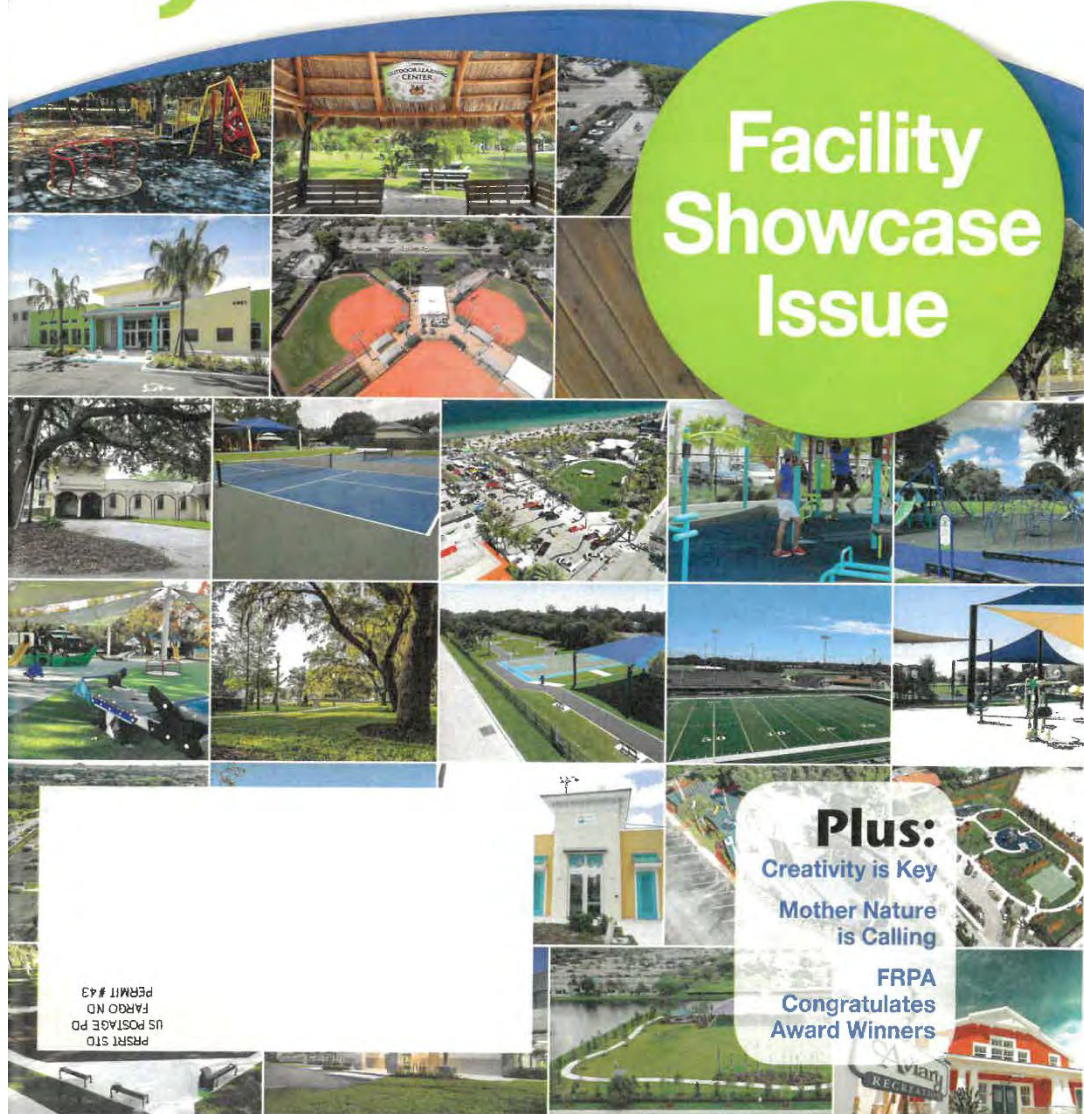

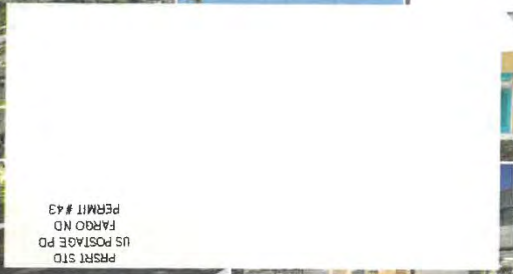

Greenwood Lakes Park is a popular destination for residents of the surrounding area and visitors to the Northwest Library branch. It includes multiple recreational opportunities, but its playground equipment, installed in 2004, had been used well past the expected lifespan and required replacement.

The new playground consists of two areas. The one for children ages two to five features a play structure with roto swing, slides, tot swings, a sensory dome, and a bonded rubber play surface. The playground for ages five to 12 has the same type of surface and a play structure with roto swing, but also offers climbing structures, slides, a deck span, and benches.

The county funded most of the project and received almost \$11,000 in grant funding.

Project Impact: The project increased incremental property values by an estimated \$2.3 million and incremental tax revenue by an estimated \$31,000. The county has realized \$53,933 savings in stormwater management costs.

FRPA Four Pillars: Installation of the new playground equipment has helped build **community** by increasing visitation. The park's revitalization has had a direct **economic** impact on the area, while its multiple recreational opportunities encourage residents to pursue a **healthy** lifestyle.

- S1 – Neighborhood children and young people visiting the nearby library branch enjoy the new equipment at Greenwood Lakes Park.
- S2 – The playground includes separate areas for children five and under and for five to 12 years old.

Thanks to a new series of YouTube videos, you can now enjoy an exciting adventure through Seminole County's natural wilderness without leaving your couch

There is adventure. Comedy. Even a dose of horror... Who knew a walk on Seminole County's wild side would include all the elements of a hit film festival?

It's all featured in *Encounters with Jim Duby*, a new series of five YouTube videos that explore the abundant and occasionally bizarre plant and animal life in Seminole County's official wilderness areas.

Jim is director of Seminole's Natural Lands Management program. In each episode, he enjoys terrific chemistry with Jessica Pickering, the county's tourism marketing director.

Jim is the bearded expert on such subjects as zombie ant graveyards and why the Econ River looks like iced tea. Jessica plays somewhat of an apprentice role as she gamely goes along on Jim's excursions.

In one episode, for example, Jim asks Jessica to rate how adventurous she is. "I mean," she says, "on a scale of one to 10, like, probably an eight."

"Three!" he quickly retorts with expert timing.

Jim was a bit reluctant when the county approached him about hosting a show promoting Seminole's nature retreats as a tourism draw.

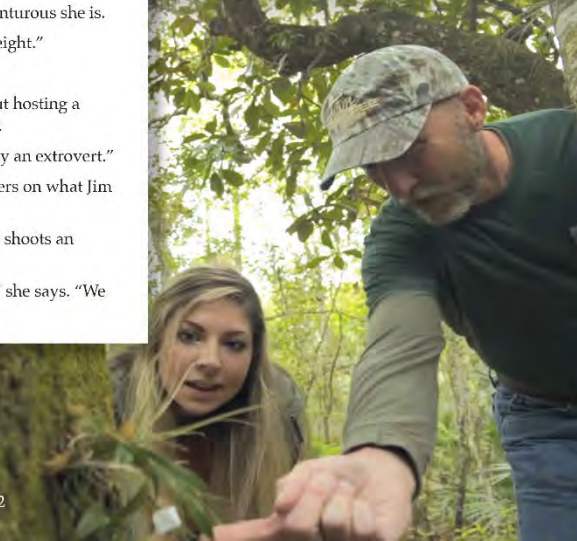
"They wanted it to be a little slapstick," he says. "I'm not really an extrovert."

But the shows manage to entertain while also educating viewers on what Jim calls Seminole's "incredibly complex nature."

Jessica, who has dabbled in theater and choir, called the video shoots an absolute blast.

"Our rapport has been totally natural since our first film day," she says. "We are honestly just being ourselves."

The Horror

Episode one takes us to the Black Hammock Wilderness Area. The hammock, we learn, refers to the canopy of dense trees.

After a pygmy rattler spotting, Jim invites his companion to feel the root-like strands at the base of a tree before revealing they are the web of a purse-web spider burrowed underneath, waiting for its victims.

"Eww!" Jessica says, flinching. "And you just let me touch it!"

Next, we learn about a plant fungus that infects certain types of ants, its fruiting body growing out of the ant's head.

"Literally like a zombie," Jessica says.

"Basically, yeah," Jim confirms.

This was not all an act. Jessica said after the series premiered that while she loves the outdoors, "I won't touch creepy critters - I will just admire them from afar."

It's a jungle out there.

Creatures and History

Episode two takes us to the Lake Harney Wilderness Area in northeast Seminole County, where we encounter eagles, alligators, black racer snakes, and, less glamorously, dung beetles.

"Do you know what the dung beetle's job is in nature?" Jim asks.

"I mean, is it in the name?" Jessica replies.

Bingo. She politely declines Jim's offer to feel the beetles' handiwork for herself.

The wilderness area is full of history, and the video captures it all.

For thousands of years, the property was occupied by Native Americans who fed on clams and snails.

Jessica and Jim eventually come across a signpost for Osceola, a once-thriving logging town.

Before I-4 and even before railroads, Jim explains, the nearby St. Johns River was the chief means of travel for Native Americans and settlers alike. Today, visitors can take it all in from a popular observation tower.

Healing Properties?

Jim and Jessica meet again in the especially scenic third episode, which takes place along part of the beloved 54-mile Econlockhatchee River.

"Jessica!"

"Jim Duby!"

"Do you just hang out at canoe launches looking for a ride?"

"I do," Jessica deadpans.

If the river's color reminds us of sweet tea, Jim says, that's because rainwater falling on the surrounding landscape leaches through dead leaves before entering the river.

Finally, we learn of larvae-eating fish employed for mosquito control and visit sulfur-smelling artesian springs where visitors once soaked, believing the water had healing powers.

All in the Details

Jim and Jessica have their final encounter at the Geneva Wilderness Area in episode four.

"Are you stalking me?" Jim says.

"I think you're stalking me," Jessica replies.

One of the pleasures of the video series is that, in between the marvelous vistas, the smallest of details pop up.

Jim introduces us to a vine whose growth tip supposedly tastes like asparagus. The petals of the wilderness area's far flower, meanwhile, are sticky, and kids at summer camp like to put one under their eyes to make a teardrop, Jim explains.

"Nature's makeup," he says.

At a fishing pier, they catch, and quickly release, a bluegill. A primitive campground, we find out, is available to reserve for overnight stays in the Geneva Wilderness Area.

Jessica's final creature encounter is with a rare indigo snake who serves as an *ambassador* at the Geneva Wilderness Area's Ed Yarborough Nature Center.

"It's been another awesome adventure," Jessica says.

"It's been my pleasure," Jim says as they part.

If this were a collector's edition DVD set, episode five would be the special-features recap where Jim and Jessica review some of their favorite moments and share deleted scenes. There is no gag reel per se, but instead a cleverly edited montage that plays on Jessica's fondness for the word "awesome."

The videos were shot and produced by Sasso Media Group. Each shoot took the better part of a day, but all the footage was edited down to a brisk five or so minutes per episode.

The results of this project reflect the wisdom of Seminole County voters, who agreed to spend a total of \$45 million over the years to buy and preserve natural lands and build nature trails.

The videos are labeled season one, hinting that there is more to come.

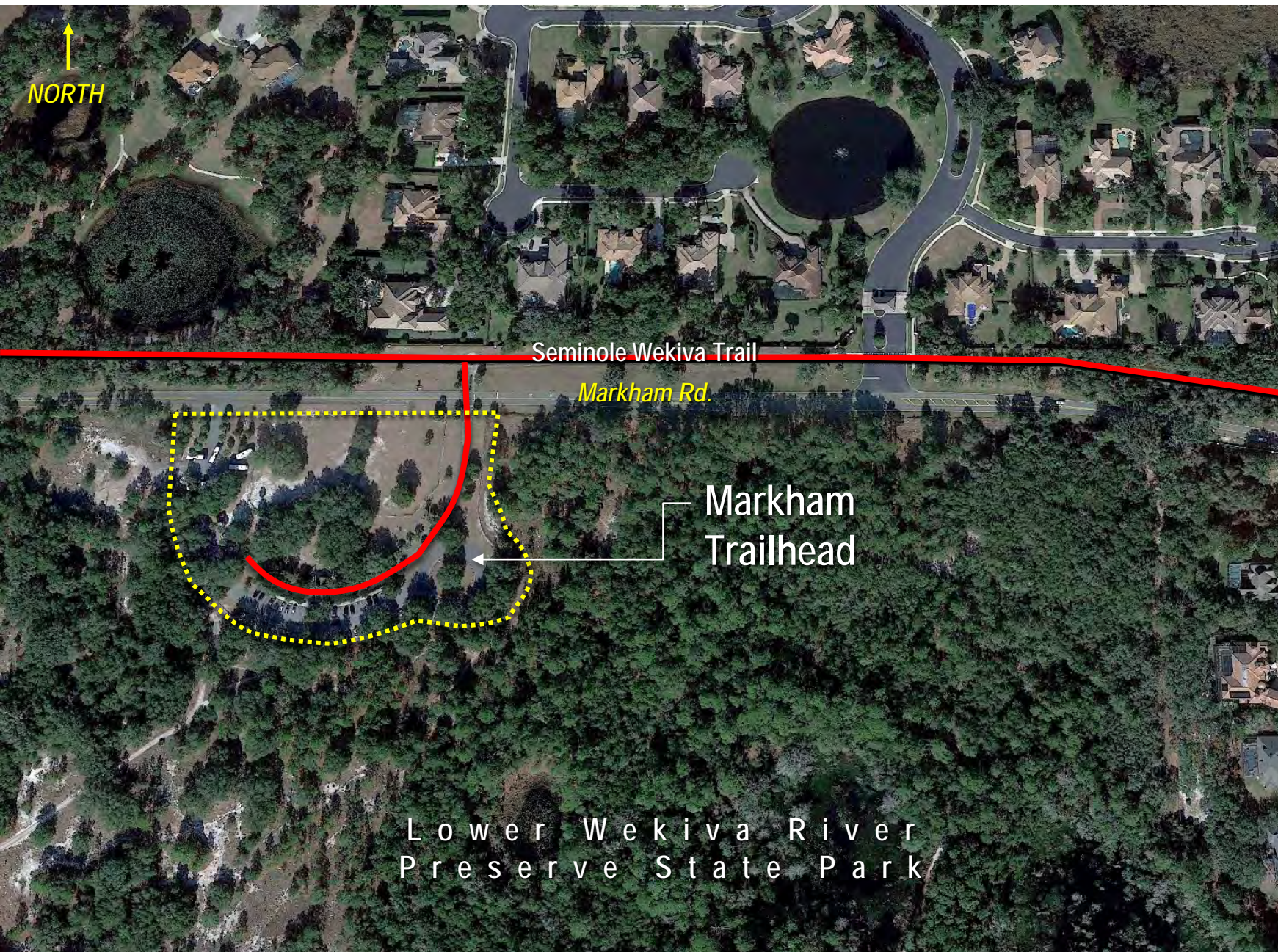

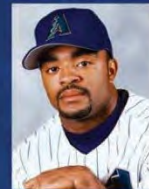
